Artists in the National Collection

- Tajudeen Jawando was born on August 7, 1948 in Lagos. He studied at the Yaba College of Technology from where he proceeded to the Norfolk State University, Virginia, USA from where he received his MFA in 1983. He practices both painting and printmaking.
- 2. Chuka Amaefuna was born in 1938. He graduated from Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria in 1963 and later took a short course in art education in London as well as a programme of studies for higher degree in African art history at the University of Science and Technology, Kumasi, Ghana. He is the founder of Alata Art Gallery in Adazi, Anambra State. He taught graphic design at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka, from 1966 to 1993, and was a professor there from 1983 until his death in 1993.
- 3. Nse-Abasi Inyang was born in Benin City, on December 7, 1959. He trained at the Ahmadu Bello University, and graduated with honors degree in sculpture. Abayomi Barber was born in Ile-Ife on October 23, 1934. He attended Yaba Technical Institute and Central School of Arts and Crafts, London (1960-1962). He was also in the studio of Manani and Tozer Ltd in London from 1960-1962 and 1964-1967 respectively. He equally worked in Nemon's St. James Palace Studio, also in London. Barber is a surrealist whose works (painting and sculpture) are distinguished by their hyper-realistic tendencies.
- 4. Uche Okeke, acclaimed dean of the uli group, is an artist and theorist of superlative merit. Born in 1933, he studied art at Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria was the founding Secretary and later President of the legendary Zaria Art Society. In 1972, on his return from further studies and studio experience in Germany, he took up teaching appointment at the Department of Fine and Applied Arts, University of Nigeria, Nsukka, becoming the first indigenous Head of Department and later Dean of the Faculty of Arts. While at Nsukka, Okeke was instrumental to the fruitful and celebrated adaptation of uli traditional design into modern Nigerian art. Although he retired from the University in 1985, his ideas and works have remained referents in the debate on modern Nigerian art.
- 5. Yusuf Grillo was born in 1934 in the Brazilian quarters of Lagos. He received his early education and later proceeded to the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology, Zaria in 1959 where he completed his diploma course in Fine Arts in 1960 and took art education course leading to the award of the Post Graduate Art Teacher's Certificate in 1961. He later took further post graduate courses and education tours in Britain, Germany, USSR, USA and joined the teaching staff of the Yaba College of

Technology in 1962 as head of art department. A celebrated painter, Grillo's studio practice spans over five decades. He was a visiting professor at the University of San Francisco and later served as Rector of Yaba College of Technology, a post he held until his retirement in 1987.

- 6. Ben Enwonwu was born in Onitsha in 1921. After his primary education, he was admitted to the Government College at Ibadan and Umuahia wherehis secondary education where he had the opportunity to study art under Kenneth C. Murray, he taught in various schools at Lagos. He later studied at Goldsmiths College of Art, London, New Cross (Ashmolean Oxford) and the Slade School of Art in London where he graduated with a Diploma in Fine Art in 1947.
- 7. Victoria Udondian was born on July 25th, 1982 in Uyo, in Akwa Ibom State of Nigeria. After attending primary and secondary school in the state, she proceeded to enroll in 1998, at the University of Uyo, Uyo where she studied painting at BA degree level, graduating with second class upper division in 2004. She is a member of several professional associations which include, Society of Nigerian Artist (SNA) and presently its National Publicity Secretary; Catalyst Women Arts and Science Portsmouth, Hampshire, UK; Female Artists Association of Nigeria (FAAN) and Visual Artist Society of Nigeria (VASON). She has taken part in several group exhibitions, Art workshops, symposia and conferences. She also has a lot of commissions to her credit.
- Erhabor Emokpae, an active member of Society of Nigerian Artist during his life time remained one of the most colorful and prolific artists of his time. Born in 1934, he attended Technical Institute, Yaba. He produced a lot of historical painting and was versatile in sculpture.
- 9. **Bruce Onobrakpeya** was born in Agbarha-otor near Ughelli in Delta State in 1932. He trained as an artist at the Nigeria College of Art, Science and Technology, Zaria, specializing in painting and graphic art. In 1961, he graduated with a Diploma in Fine and Applied Arts and the following year he passed the post graduate Art teachers Certificate Examination. From 1963 onwards he was the art teacher at St Gregory's College, Lagos from where he proceeded on leave in 1979, and subsequently took to studio practice. He has been artist-in-residence in Hay Mounting School of Art and Craft, Maine, U.S.A, (1975); Elizabeth City State University, North Carolina, (1979); and the Institute of African Studies, University of Ibadan (1984). With studio practice straddling several decades, Onobrakpeya remains one of the most exciting printmakers to emerge from Africa in the 20th century

- 10. Haig David-West was born in Port Harcourt and grew up in the United Republic of Cameroun. He studied art at Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, University of Wisconsin at Madison, and the Academy of Fine Arts in Warsaw, Poland. He has been living, working and teaching in universities in the USA.
- George Babatunde was born in 1957 in Ile-Ife. He obtained a Higher National Diploma from Yaba College of Technology specializing in sculpture. He has been working in wood as his principal medium.
- 12. Theresa Akinwale distinguished herself as one of the most competent and successful portraitists of her era. She was born in Abeokuta, Ogun State, Nigeria and educated at St Peter's School and St Mathew's Primary School, Lafiaji, both in Lagos. From there, she proceeded to Our Lady of Apostle's School, Yaba where she spent two years before going to the Nazareth Teachers Training College, Ibonwon, Epe, where she was exposed to art. She later taught at the Holy Trinity School, Imomo, Ijebuode and Mount Camel School, Ebute Metta Lagos, 1954-1956 and 1956-1957 respectively. Theresa subsequently studied at Benneth College, Sheffield where she got a Diploma in commercial art in 1958 at the same time she was pursuing another programme in nursing. She also studied art at the Camberwell School of Art and Craft and then, City and Guild of London Art School, Kennington Road, London, 1961-1964.
- 13. Paul Igboanugo was born in Oraifte, Anambra State of Nigeria in 1940. He was trained first at Yaba College of Technology before continuing his studies at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka. He was further trained in advanced printmaking techniques in the United Kingdom before he took up teaching position at the Yaba College of Technology, Lagos, and later Federal Polytechnic, Oko, Anambra State from where he recently retired.
- 14. Chris Echeta was born on September 9, 1953 at Igboukwu. He graduated from the University of Nigeria, Nsukka with B.A and M.F.A, degrees in ceramics in 1979 and 2001 respectively. He is currently pursuing his Ph.D programme at the same university. He has taught and lectured in various schools, including Federal Polytechnic, Auchi in Edo State and presently at Cross Rivers University of Technology, Calabar, Nigeria. A member of the once-prestigious AKA Circle of Exhibiting Artists, he has participated in several group and solo exhibitions and executed several commissions.
- Best Ochigbo was born on August 4, 1958, and had his art training at Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria where he obtained B.A. and MFA degrees. He later completed a doctoral programme in Mass Communication at University of Uyo, Akwa Ibom State,


- of the few artists who had gone through both traditional and contemporary artistic training, having come from a family of carvers and trained under his immediate father who is of the 3rd generation of artists in the Bamidele family.
- 16. Amos Odion was born in 1943 and had his training under Ben Aye, Felix Idubor, and Erhabor Emokpae and attended course at Yaba College of Technology. He featured in many one-man, joint and group exhibitions in Nigeria and abroad, working mostly in wood.
- 17. Chike Aniakor was born in 1940. He was educated at C.M.S Central School, Abatete and New Bethel College, Onitsha, 1955-59. He trained at Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, for his first degree (1960-64). His post graduate course was in art education at A.B.U, Zaria (Art Teachers Certificate, 1965). He further trained at Indiana University where he got his MA in Art History (1974) and Ph.D (1975). Aniakor became a Senior Lecturer in Painting and Art History at University of Nigeria, Nsukka by 1980. He was also a consultant and research associate, University of New Orleans, Baton Rouge, New Orleans, USA (1974). An erudite scholar, his works have featured in exhibitions in and outside Nigeria.
- 18. Gani Odutokun was born on August 9, 1947 in Ghana. He was a graduate of Ahmadu Bello University ABU, Zaria. After graduation he returned to ABU where he taught painting. Gani was one of those artists whose works participated in the FESTAC '77, alongside that of other contemporaries like Kolade Oshinowo, Dele Jegede, and Shina Yussuf. His painting Durbar is currently in the collection of National Gallery of Art. Odutokun died in a ghastly road disaster in 1995.
- 19. Joe Musa is an alumnus of Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University, USA. He had earlier attended Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria for his degree course in Fine Arts, graduating in first class in Painting and Art History. Before this time, he had a Higher National Diploma in Fine and Applied Art (sculpture) from Benue State Polytechnic, Ugbokolo, Benue State, Nigeria. A practicing painter, Musa has worked as an art journalist, gallery proprietor, and recently the Director General of National Gallery of Art, Abuja, Nigeria. He has several solo and group exhibitions to his credit.
- 20. Yomi Adetoro was born in Lagos Island Local Government Area of Lagos State on April 22, 1939. 1956 to 1961, Adetoro attended Ahmadiya College, Agege, Lagos State, Nigeria where he obtained his West African School Certificate. Then he proceeded to ABU, Zaria for his Bachelors Degree programme and came out with Second Class Upper Division in Fine Arts in 1968. He got his MA (Fine Arts) in textile design and fabric decoration from A.B.U., Zaria in 1972. He further got a Ph.D in Higher Education

- Nigeria. He has been teaching painting in the department of Fine and Industrial Arts, University of Uyo. He is a member of Nogh-Nogh Art Movement, Society of Nigerian Artists (S.N.A), and Art Historical Association of Nigeria (A.H.A.N).
- 22. Francis Osague was born in Benin City, Edo State in 1941. He trained in Felix idubor's studio in Lagos before proceeding to Rome for further studies at the Academy of Fine Art from where he graduated in 1964. He subsequently obtained a Masters Degree at the University of Chicago, U.S.A. in 1971, having won a silver medal in the International Student Exhibition in 1963. He held three solo exhibitions in Chicago (1969-71) and has participated in group exhibitions in Nigeria and Abroad.
- Olumuyiwa Spencer was born in 1956 and had his secondary education in Abeokuta from 1971-74. He studied art privately under Mr Abayomi Barber of the University of Lagos while working at the same time for the West African Examination Council. He later worked with the National Council for Arts and Culture and has practiced successfully as a painter.
- 24. Bisi Fakeye in the early 1960's worked under his uncle, Lamidi Fakeye, who is also a renowned carver. He had his formal education at the Ife Divisional Teachers Training College and took part in several art exhibitions within and outside Nigeria.
- 25. Olu Ajayi was born in 1963 in Ososo, Edo state. He attended Auchi Polytechnic between 1981 and 1984 and obtained a Higher National Diploma in Fine and Applied Arts. He is the only painting major graduate of 1984 set and the first among his generation to delve into full time studio practice.
- 26. Jimoh Braimoh was born in 1943 in Osogbo, Osun State of Nigeria. He is one of the most influential artists to emerge from the 1960's experimental workshops known as the Osogbo Art School. His works blends Western and Yoruba styles using motifs that characterized the Osogbo experiment. Buraimoh is prolific in oil painting and etching as well as his widely acclaimed bead painting and mosaic murals.
- 27. Joshua Akande was born in 1942 at Owa Kajola, Igbomina, Ekiti Division of Kwara State. He graduated in 1970 from Ahmadu Bello University and has since devoted his attention to the teaching of art in secondary schools. He specializes in painting.
- 28. Gabriel Bamidele was born on September 18, 1948 at Osi-Ekiti Local Government Area of Kwara State. He attended St Fimbers College, Akoka, Yaba Lagos before going to study in the Department of Fine Applied Arts of Ahmadu Bello University (ABU), Zaria where he obtained his Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts in sculpture. He is one

- Academic Administration (major) and Industrial Arts (minor) from North Texas State University, Denton, USA.
- 30. Sina Yussuf, a painter and muralist, with a good knowledge of graphics was born in 1945 in Ijebu-Ode, Ogun State of Nigeria. He obtained his professional training from Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria between 1968 and 1972 after a successful basic education in Lagos.
- 31. Ben Osawe was born in 1931 at Agbor in the present Edo State of Nigeria. Osawe left to England in 1956 to study at the London school of Graphic Art. From there, he proceeded to Camberwell School of Art in London where he spent five years. While in England, he achieved modest success as a young sculptor, participating in several group shows in galleries and museums in London.
- 32. Josy Ajiboye was born in Erinmope Ekiti in Ondo State of Nigeria. He was trained by the Sudan Interior Mission and later studied commercial art, illustration and painting at the Yaba College of Technology. Ajiboye worked as a cartoonist in the defunct Sunday Times.
- 33. David H. Dale was born in Kano, Nigeria. He attended Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria. He attended Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria where he obtained a B.A. (Honours) degree in Fine Arts and Art History in 1971. A versatile and renowned artist, David Dale works most of the time in deep-etching, engraving, bead-work, plastocast in epoxy resin and metal foil.
- 34. Obiora Udechukwu has been a distinguished Dana Professor, Fine Arts Department, Lawrence University, Canton, New York, where he continues to teach. As a Professor at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka, he played a leading role in molding many of the Nsukka artists. One of Nigeria's leading artists, he has done much to organize artists' groups for exhibitions.



MOSTAFA ABD EL-MOUTY

ostafa Abd El- Mouty was born in Alexandria, Egypt in 1938. He graduated from the Academy of Fine Arts in Alexandria (Department of Painting) 1962 and is one of the founders of the 'Experimental Group' created in 1958. Abd El Mouty was granted a scholarship offered by the Egyptian government for the studies on Upper Egypt, and then later for the Northern part of the Delta.

In 1974, he took part in a governmental expedition to Spain. He was later nominated as a professor of Art from the San Fernando Academy of Art where he obtained a Diploma in Restoration, and a Diploma in Mural Painting.

He became a member of the World Congress of Contemporary Art in Venice, in 1985, and was elected Vice President the same year. He occupied the post of Head of the Egyptian Academy in Rome in 1988 and obtained the State Merit Award in 2001.

He is a member of the Artists and Writers Group of the Alexandria Atelier, and one of the artists on exterior mission to the Academy of Arts in Carrara, Italy, for stone carving exhibition in 2000 to 2004.

aroq Wahba was born in 1942 at Mansura, Nile Delta, Egypt. He graduated from Alexandria Faculty of Fine Arts in 1968 and obtained M.Sc in "Alienation" as a phenomenon in contemporary painting, in 1977 from the National Academy of Art, Dusseldorf and PhD (Arts) in The Role of Material in Painting, from the University of Alexandria, in 1988.




REDA ABDEL- SALAM SADKA


IBRAHIM EL DESSOUKI
